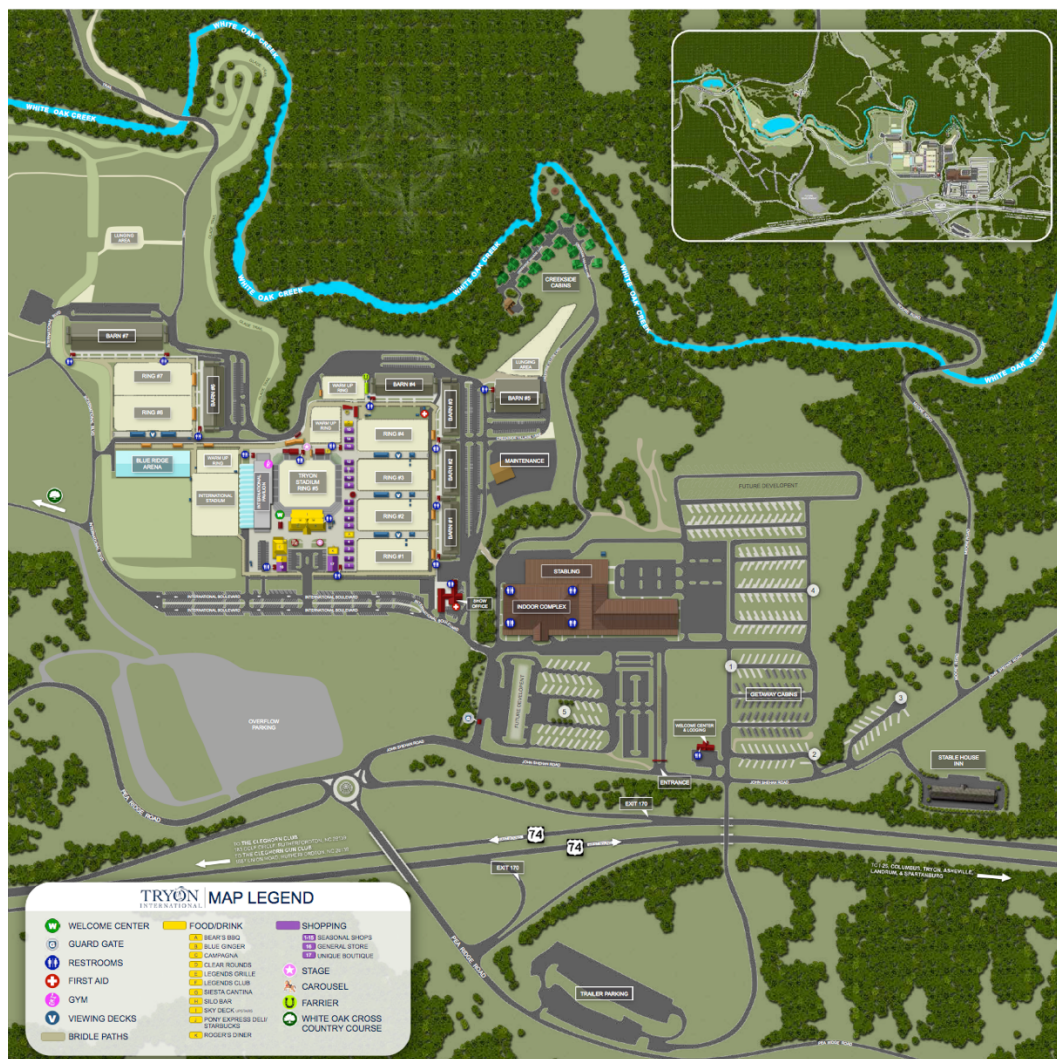

RULES AND REGULATIONS

— It is the responsibility of each exhibitor to read, understand and adhere to all rules and regulations for this show. —

1. **USEF MEMBERSHIP STATEMENT:** Life, senior active and junior (youth) active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, or agent at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes. **EVERY RIDER, OWNER, LESSEE, AGENT, HANDLER OR TRAINER AT THIS SHOW MUST ALSO BE A MEMBER IN GOOD STANDING WITH THE PASO FINO HORSE ASSOCIATION.**
2. All horses shown in this event (and/or stabled on the grounds) must be entered under their full registered names.
3. **USEF FEES:** The USEF FEE (\$25 per horse; \$15 Drug Fee/\$10 Administration Fee per horse) is mandatory. It funds random drug testing of horses at U.S. Equestrian shows and administration of USEF.
4. **USEF RULES:** EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT PFHA RULE BOOK AND THE USEF RULE BOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH. See USEF Rule PF for PASO FINO rules, class descriptions & judging specifications. Changes in USEF rules will automatically become a part of this Prize List. Show Committee reserves right to make such changes in procedure, personnel, rules & regulations as deemed by them to be in the best interest of the show.
5. **ARENA:** *Descriptions & Admission:* No person permitted in arena during classes except judges, assistants, exhibitors in class & show photographer. One attendant per exhibitor may enter the ring with permission from the Judges in accordance with the PFHA Rule Book in Walk-Corto Leadline, Driving, Costume, Fabulous Fino Futurity, Fabulous Performance Futurity and Fabulous Pleasure Futurity classes. Attendants who enter the ring shall be considered a part of the showing team and must be neatly dressed as per the requirements of the class. All competition/riding rings have all-weather footing that consists of sand and synthetic material mixture and draining system. Arena measurements: 140' X 340' with multiple indoor warm-up areas.
Gate Entry: There will be a pre-determined order of going into the arena for each class. Horses will enter by exhibitor number rotation. No exceptions. Should an exhibitor refuse to enter the show ring in the pre-determined order in a timely fashion, the entry will be disqualified.
6. **AMATEUR CLASSES:** All adult riders in Amateur classes MUST have a current USEF Amateur Certification Card in their possession or make application for one at the Horse Show Office prior to receiving back numbers. Application forms for USEF Amateur Certification may be obtained from USEF. There is no charge for amateur certification for Senior or Life Members of USEF. All participants (Youth and Adult) in Amateur classes must have a current PFHA Amateur Certification Card in their possession or make application for one at the Horse Show Office prior to receiving back numbers. PFHA Amateur Certification is free.
7. **ARRIVAL TIME:** Arrival on Sat., Sept. 12 for PLATINUM and GOLD sponsors ONLY. All remaining exhibitors may arrive on Sunday, September 13. Contact Rick Meyer (314-520-5707) for any questions concerning early arrivals. **NOTE: If you have not purchased a PLATINUM or GOLD sponsorship and arrive on Saturday, you will be leveled a surcharge of \$2,500.**
8. **AWARDS:** In regular classes, six (6) places and one (1) honorable mention will be awarded, 1st–6th will receive ribbons. In Grand Championship classes, four (4) places and one (1) honorable mention will be awarded, 1st–4th will receive ribbons. In the Walk-Corto Leadline class, each exhibitor shall receive a ribbon.
9. **AWARDS CONDUCT IN RING:**
 1. When being presented an award, the horse must come to and remain at a complete halt and under control. A handler may assist or exhibitor may dismount to take control of the horse.
 2. Exhibitors who do not keep their horse at a complete halt and under control, will be handed their award(s) or asked to pick up their award(s) outside of the arena.
 3. The 1st and 2nd Places shall have the option of going down the sounding board. Once the first-place winner has been announced, no other horse may traverse the sounding board or remain in the ring. ONLY THE FIRST PLACE HORSE may take a victory ride around the ring.
10. **BEDDING:** You may bring your own bedding. Only wood shavings are allowed. Three (3) bags shavings are included with each stall. Additional shavings can be ordered on site via the Show Secretary Office. Shavings are \$10 a bag.
11. **CALL FOR CLASSES:** The public-address system is a courtesy. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to have his or her horse at the gate at the start of any class. Every effort is made to maintain a working public address system, but Show Management is not liable for technical problems with the system that may occur. No refund will be made, schedule changed or protest upheld on the basis of a PA failure. Exhibitors will be expected to enter the ring in a timely manner per USEF Rule PF-102 6.b. which says, "When horses are competing collectively, if horses do not enter in the in-gate ready to participate, after the in-gate is open, within two minutes, a warning is issued, and horses are given two minutes before the gate is closed and judging commences, or the class is canceled."
12. **LODGING:** Please contact the Tryon Lodging Department at 828-863-1015 to inquire about available onsite/offsite lodging options, reserve a room, cabin or camper/ RV site or golf cart. All reservations and payment for all reservations must be made directly to the Lodging Department. Campers/RVs/cabins, etc. may NOT be put on show bills, nor split on Trainer Accounts.
13. **CHAMPIONSHIP CLASSES:** To be eligible for entry, a horse must have been properly entered, shown and judged in one (1) of the qualifying classes. For all classes where the qualifying class falls on the same day as the championship, please enter as soon as possible after qualifying. These entries will qualify for the lower entry fee. Entries and payment for all other championship classes should be made by the day prior to the class. However, entries will be accepted at an increased fee if received at least five (5) classes prior to the championship.
14. **COVID-19 ACTION PLAN:** Every PFHA GNS exhibitor and participant agrees to abide by the US Equestrian Federation COVID-19 Action Plan Requirements. Due to the Covid-19 pandemic, all programs, properties, events and related specifications are subject to change in accordance with federal, state and local laws and regulations. The plan can be found here: www.usef.org/media/coronavirus-resources.
15. **DEPARTURE TIME:** All horses and equipment must be clear of the grounds by **Noon on Sunday, September 20.**
16. **DISCIPLINE:** Exhibitors are hereby notified that the PFHA Board of Directors will strictly enforce and actively support all PFHA and/or USEF rules regarding sportsmanship, conduct & courtesy at all PFHA recognized shows and events. This includes but is not limited to rules that govern owners, exhibitors, agents, trainers, managers, riders, drivers, handlers, competition officials, competition employees and members of the families of the above, individual members of PFHA or any person who acts in a manner in violation of the Rules or deemed prejudicial to its best interests. Any PFHA and/or USEF violations committed will be subject to the PFHA and/or USEF penalties.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

17. **DIVISION OF CLASSES:** Show Management reserves the right to cancel, combine or divide any class when advisable and to reschedule any divided class. Riding classes with 30 or more entries will be assigned to either Section A or B. Sections will be posted at the Show Office. Other classes may be divided for reasons of safety or otherwise at discretion of Management. Once split, classes will not be recombined on the day of the class regardless of the number of entries.
18. **DOGS LEASH REQUIREMENTS:** Dogs on the show grounds must be leashed/kenneled at all times. Pet owners are responsible for cleaning up after their pets. Individuals must not lead dogs on a leash while mounted. Dog owners are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from their dogs' behaviors. Dog owners failing to comply with this rule may be subject to penalty under Chapters 6 and 7, as well as issuance of warning cards. Any dog that is deemed aggressive by Tryon staff or security will be asked to be removed from property or put away in the owner's residence.
19. **ELIGIBILITY:** Qualifying Points are required for the 2026 PFHA GNS. The Fabulous Futurity classes—Futurity horses must have been nominated through the Futurity Program. Entries in the "Geldings for Gold" and "Amateur Geldings for Gold" classes must meet the eligibility requirements of the Paso Fino Horse Association "Geldings for Gold" program and "Amateur Geldings for Gold."
20. **ENTRIES:** Show Management reserves the right to decline any entry and return any entry fee before or during the show without liability for further compensation. Exhibitors are cautioned to be aware of and to abide by restrictions concerning exhibiting horses before judges as provided in USEF Chapter 8, Article 804 and PFHA Rules, Chapter Five, IX, General Conflict of Interest Rules Governing Showing under Judges.
21. **ENTRY FORMS:** One horse per entry form. All entries must be paid in full when submitted. Each entry form must be signed by the owner and/or the owner's legal agent, the trainer, the rider, the driver or handler, and the coach (if applicable). Please provide your email address with all entry forms so that we may confirm receipt. If the owner is the trainer, the owner must sign twice. If the trainer is also the rider, driver or handler, then the trainer must sign twice. If owner or exhibitor is under 18 years of age, the entry must be signed by a representative who is of age and who, by such signature, individually accepts the responsibility and risk stated on the entry. **Juniors and sub-juniors are not allowed to have their name signed on entry forms!**
22. **ENTRY DEADLINE:** All entries, supporting documentation and stall request forms must be submitted via online entry system or scanned and emailed or mailed to the Show Secretary, entries@pfha.org. Entries sent with no payment will be considered post entries and charged the post entry fees. Exhibitors are responsible for their own errors and those of their agents in the preparation of entry blanks.
Packets/exhibitor numbers will not be released until all entries are complete. Post entries are accepted in adherence to the Schedule of Fees. Refer to the complete Schedule of Fees for other important information. Show Management is not responsible for lost entries. Please provide your email address with ALL ENTRY FORMS so we can confirm receipt of your entry via email!!
The deadline for qualifying is August 31.
23. **FARRIER:** There will be an official farrier available at the show.
24. **FIRE REGULATIONS: NO SMOKING ALLOWED IN THE BARNS!** Smoking is permitted in designated smoking areas only. The use of flammable liquids or open flames is strictly prohibited. Trailer parking is not permitted in any barn area. Trailers may pull into the barn areas only to actively unload.
25. **HEALTH REQUIREMENTS:**
 1. All horses coming into the State of North Carolina and NC owned horses must be accompanied by a current negative Coggins Certificate (EIA) issued within 12 months. A copy of all coggins must be mailed with entries and must be left on file in the show office. In addition, a copy must be posted on the stall door for inspection by the State Veterinarian. All non-showing horses on the grounds must be listed on an entry blank and present a coggins certificate as listed above.
 2. All horses shipped into the State of North Carolina must have the required health certificates issued by a veterinarian from the state of region. A health certificate dated within 30 days prior to the end of the show is required for all out-of-state horses. These must be available for inspection during the show and be in accordance with North Carolina state law. Negative coggins test required for each horse.
 3. Horses entering the grounds must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering the stables. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be required to leave the competition grounds upon request by competition management. Documentation should consist of one of the following methods mentioned below. The frequency of vaccine administration should be per the vaccine manufacturers' or veterinarian's recommendations. It is recommended that vaccines are administered by or under the direction of a veterinarian.

In the case of vaccines administered by a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by competition management, must provide documentation from the veterinarian on documenting that the horse in question received the vaccinations; name of the vaccine and date of vaccine administration.

In the case of vaccines administered by a person other than a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by competition management, must provide a receipt of the vaccine purchase, which is signed by the owner, or agent with care, custody and control of the horse; name, serial number and expiration date of the vaccine; and date of vaccine administration.

In case of a horse that is unable to receive either of the vaccinations due to a history of adverse reactions, the exhibitor, upon request by competition management, must provide a letter from the veterinarian on official letterhead stating that the horse in question cannot be vaccinated due to medical concerns and a log of temperatures taken twice daily for seven days prior to entering the competition grounds. These horses must also have their temperatures taken and logged twice daily while on the competition grounds. The log of temperatures should be provided to the competition management when requested.
 4. Any horse not in compliance must be removed from the grounds—no exceptions!
26. **INDEMNITY & NON-RESPONSIBILITY CLAUSE:** All entries are accepted with the understanding that PFHA and the World Equestrian Center will not be held responsible for any loss, damage or injury to any horse exhibited or any article of any kind. All horses shall be under the control and direction of the Show Committee but solely at the risk of the exhibitor, who will be responsible for any loss, damage or injury to any person, animal or property occasioned by him, his agents or employees, or by any animal owned or exhibited by him, and shall indemnify PFHA and the World Equestrian Center against any and all loss, damages and liability thus occasioned, including attorney fees, which may be incurred as a result thereof. Submitting of an entry form to Show Secretary shall constitute an acceptance of each person signing same of the provision herein set forth.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

27. **INSPECTIONS:** Before entering the arena, all Exhibitors will be asked to go through a check in area and their horse will be inspected by the Show Veterinarian, the Farrier and the PFHA Steward or PFHA/USEF Steward. All exhibitors will come with their horses tacked up, but with bit and bridle in hand for Steward Inspection. Only the bit that is inspected will be allowed in the holding area. Once in holding area, if bit needs to be changed the exhibitor and horse must go back through the inspection area if time is permitted. **No spurs permitted in holding area**, except for horses entered in the Specialty classes. The farrier will be checking for lameness and the legality of the shoes. Trainer, owner or exhibitor may assist in lifting feet. Any horse refusing to have all four hooves inspected will not be allowed to compete. Exhibitors shall be familiar with the rules prohibiting soring as per Paso Fino Horse Association Rules, Chapter Two, IV, Paragraph E; and with rules concerning shoeing as per Paso Fino Horse Association Rules, Chapter Two IV, Paragraph C. All horses entered in classes at the National Show shall have their four (4) hooves inspected in the paddock area prior to competition, per Paso Fino Horse Association Rule Chapter Two, IV, Paragraph H and Chapter Four, Section 1, F. Soundness Check: Exhibitor will present to Veterinarian for soundness exam. Each entry will undergo a soundness check at the walk and corto or fino, consisting of a figure eight. Bella Forma entries will complete the exam in halter with one handler only. If 2 of 3 judges report a horse that appears to be lame during competition, the inspection veterinarian will be called into the arena to certify. The horse will complete the soundness check (two circles clockwise, straight path, two circles counterclockwise). Upon veterinarian certification, the entry will be disqualified for lameness.
28. **INSUFFICIENT FUNDS/DECLINED CREDIT CARDS:** If any checks presented for payment are returned because of insufficient funds or if any credit cards presented for payment are declined or are invalid, the entry must be considered NOT ENTERED and a \$100 Insufficient Fund/Declined Credit Card fee will be charged.
29. **JUDGING SYSTEM APPROVED:** Majority Opinion Three Judge Divisional Scoring System. Non-Conferring.
30. **JUNIOR EXHIBITORS:** A junior exhibitor's age shall be determined by the exhibitor's age on the first day (September 1) of the current show year, and this age shall remain the same throughout the show year. **The age of the youth exhibitor on September 1, 2025 is the age of the youth exhibitor for the 2026 GNS.**
31. **YOUTH SIGNATURES:** No one under 18 may sign the entry blank or release forms. There needs to be a parent or agent signature on the entry blank and release forms for the youth exhibitor.
32. **MOTORIZED VEHICLE STATEMENT:** Minors who do not have a valid driver's license, which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above-described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs & other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials & management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to Segways, hover boards and single-wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.
- Any individual using a golf cart must have a signed copy of this rule on file with the Show Office. The form is located in this Prize List.
33. **PERSONAL CHECKS:** Show Management is not permitted to cash personal checks during the show.
34. **PHOTOGRAPHS:** The first and second place horses in each class are not required to have their photographs taken by the Official Show Photographer. Action shots from the ring will be used. Cody Parmenter is the Official GNS Photographer. No other photographer may enter the arena, sell still photographic images taken in or of the arena during the show or any exclusively covered show special event either online or in person during or after the show.
35. **PRIZE MONEY:** Futurity, Geldings for Gold, Breeders' Sweepstakes and Amateur competitions is calculated and distributed according to the guidelines for each of those divisions. Paybacks will be mailed to the first owner of the horse listed on the entry form unless specified otherwise on the indicated line. A completed W-9 Form for each owner receiving prize money must accompany all entries. Paybacks will not be credited toward your show bill. All fees must be paid at the show. Prize money will be mailed within 30 days following completion of the show. **No entry will be accepted or considered complete without a W-9 Form.**
36. **REFUND SCHEDULE:** Horses scratched with vet certificate on vet letterhead after August 15, 2026, 50% of sany stall fees, but will be refunded 100% of class fees only. Geldings for Gold and Breeders' Sweepstakes fees are nonrefundable. Once a horse has been scratched from any class with a veterinarian excuse said horse will not be allowed to compete in any additional classes in the show
- Horses that have not qualified by August 31, may apply for and receive a full refund. Any and all refunds will be issued after completion of the National Show. To receive a refund, you must have a receipt from the Show Secretary. No refunds will be issued after December 1, 2026.
37. **SAFE SPORT STATEMENT:** *Reminder:* All USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirement to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. More information about these can be found at www.usef.org.
38. **SCRATCHES:** In fairness to other exhibitors and to keep the show on schedule, exhibitors shall report all scratches to the Show Secretary Office. Failure to report scratches prior to the start of the class may result in a fine as determined by Show Management. Tack and exhibitor changes must be requested via text to the Show Secretary the night before the class.
39. **SECURITY:** Tryon International Security: 828-863-1019
40. **SHARPS CONTAINERS:** Sharps Containers: USEF GR1210.4 Competition management shall place a minimum of one sharps container per each competition, whether or not stabling is provided. Additionally, at least one sharps container per 50 occupied stalls for the disposal of needles and other disposable sharp instruments in.

The show office staff will close out all accounts not settled by Saturday afternoon, September 19. Accounts that have not been settled by exhibitors will be charged a \$25 closing fee by the show office.

42. **SPLITTING STALL FEES:** Exhibitors may split fees for stalls if the request is in writing via email to the Show Secretary and processed PRIOR to arrival at the show. No requests can be honored after September 8.

NOTE: Splits will only be applied at the time of submitted entries and upon receipt of the form. **NO EXCEPTIONS!**

43. **STABLING:** Permanent stalls are 12'x12' with full doors, mats & fans in permanent barns. No temporary equipment may be permanently attached to any existing property such as signs, barricades, stabling, trees, etc. staples, nails, and/or screws of any kind are not allowed. No exhibitors will be allowed to show out of their trailers. A stall must be purchased for each horse on the show grounds. Horses must be placed in their assigned stalls and may not be moved without the consent of Show Management.

NOTE: Horses not entered in a class in the show will be charged the Visiting Horse fee (if stalls are available) and must have required coggins, health papers and vaccination records.

NOTE: Premium stalling will not be assigned unless financial obligations have been met in full.

44. **STALLS—BARN DAMAGE:** Exhibitors will be financially responsible for any damage to their stalls on the premises. Do not put nails into the sidewalls. Stalls must be vacated in their original condition. Stalls may not be structurally altered in any way.
NOTE: All charges for damages that Tryon charges PFHA GNS will be billed back to the exhibitor.

This charge will be automatically added to your final invoice at the Show Secretary's office. Charges from the Tryon billed to the GNS for removal of lumber or other items used for decorating purposes will be billed back to the exhibitor after the conclusion of the show.

45. **STALLS – PREMIUM:** Premium Stalls will be assigned by the Show Chairperson, based on Sponsorship Level.

46. **TRAILERS:** Park in designated areas only.

47. **WASH RACKS:** Wash racks are for washing only. Please clean up after your horse and remove your horse to the stall area for drying and grooming.

SPECIAL CLASSES

GELDINGS FOR GOLD RULES

1. There will be three (3) Amateur Geldings for Gold classes and three (3) Geldings for Gold classes: one Amateur Pleasure, one Amateur Performance and one Amateur Fino as well as one Pleasure, one Performance and one Fino.
2. Each class division will be open to all geldings age 30 months and older who have qualified for the National Show by accumulating the required 20 points at sanctioned Paso Fino shows in their respective amateur and open divisions.
3. The entry fee for each Amateur Geldings for Gold & Geldings for Gold class is \$220 per horse plus the National Show class entry fee at the time of the entry with the gelding to be entered. Fees are paid as you would for any National Show class.
4. There are no refunds on the \$220 fee; however, refunds of the National Show class entry fee fall within the existing PFHA rules and apply to the Amateur Geldings for Gold and Geldings for Gold classes.

FABULOUS FUTURITY RULES

To Qualify for the Fabulous Futurity Classes

1. Horses must have been nominated through the program and must enter appropriate classes and all program fees paid. **A photo of the scanned microchip number (as proof that the microchip matches what is on file with the PFHA) is required when submitting the entry.**
2. All Futurity entries must have microchips recorded with the PFHA. It is the responsibility of exhibitors to have the correct microchips in Futurity entries. Microchips will be scanned for verification to allow time if there is an issue that arises prior to the day of the class. **PRE-SCANNING WILL BE DONE BY A STEWARD IN THE BARN AT EACH HORSES STALL.**
3. **MANDATORY SCANNING IN THE WARM-UP AREA BEFORE THE CLASS.** Any horse presented to the warm-up ring that does not match its microchip number will be disqualified. **NO EXCEPTION TO THIS RULE.**
4. Eligible horses who qualify are NOT automatically entered into a futurity class. The Futurity Class must be included on the horse's entry form as any regular class would be. Once entry has been received by the show secretary, the division has been declared and no class change will be allowed. The entry fees are as published in this prize list.

No Entries Accepted After August 24. No Exceptions.

All Futurity Pre-Class Warm-Up Procedures

1. Entries for the Fabulous Futurity classes are presented to the warm-up arena to be inspected by the veterinarian and farrier. Any entry that does not pass the inspection by the vet or farrier is disqualified per National Show procedure. Microchips will also be verified upon entry into the warm-up ring. Any horse presented to the warm-up ring that does not match its microchip number on record with PFHA will be disqualified.
2. Entries report to the warm-up arena saddled and bridled. A show steward inspects the tack of the horse and attire of the rider. The tack and attire for each class will be the same as for the schooling classes of the particular division for which the horse is entered in the Fabulous Futurity class. Each entry will be allowed only one handler in addition to the rider. Attire of the handler is not relevant. After passing the inspections of vet, farrier, and steward, entries proceed to the warm-up arena (presided over by at least one designated steward) and wait quietly for further instruction. Entries may be hand walked, but no other warm-up is allowed (no lunging or riding).
3. Upon instruction from the presiding steward and with the paddock announcer acting as timekeeper, riders are instructed to mount their horses and are allowed five minutes to warm up before the class is called into the show arena.
4. If a rider has been granted a tack change from a previous class, the presiding steward and timekeeper will wait until the tack change is complete before calling for riders to mount their horses.
5. After the five-minute warm-up, riders may remain on their horses and stand quietly or may dismount and stand or walk the horse. No further mounted warm-up will be allowed. Once the class is called, all riders must mount their horses and proceed in at a walk or gait directly to the show arena. Handlers may remain in the warm-up arena until the entries proceed to the show arena.
6. Any entry arriving late to the warm-up arena forfeits any time lapsed in the five-minute warm-up. Regardless of warm up time, they must proceed with the other horses and riders into the show arena when called.
7. Entries that do not follow this warm-up procedure as directed by presiding steward or paddock announcer (keeper) may be disqualified at the discretion of the judge.

SPECIAL CLASSES

FABULOUS FUTURITY PLEASURE CLASS

Qualifying Gaits

1. **Corto:** A smooth, steady, unbroken, evenly-spaced four-beat lateral gait, rhythmic, executed with moderate extension and mild collection. Forward speed is ground covering but unhurried. Movements should be fluid, willing, relaxed, balanced and free- moving. The horse's head carriage is natural and relaxed.
2. **Largo:** A smooth, evenly spaced four-beat lateral gait, fluid and rapid, showing no tendency to labor or become "strung out." Collection is mild. Both extension and rapidness of cadence are increased over the Paso Corto and a definite change of speed must be observed. The evenly spaced four-beat cadence must be maintained at all times, and loss of cadence, form or smoothness due to excessive speed shall be penalized.
3. **Flat Walk:** A true, evenly spaced four-beat, flat-footed, smooth gait executed with mild collection. The horse's head carriage is natural and relaxed.

Judging

This class will be judged: 20% on Corto; 20% on Largo; 10% on walk; 30% on the performance of the individual tests; 10% on appearance, conformation and way of going; and 10% on manners.

Procedures

1. **Warm Up:** All entries will follow the Fabulous Futurity Pre-class Warm-up Procedure in the paddock before the class
2. **Class Requirements:** Horses enter the ring to the right in a counterclockwise manner at a Corto until directed otherwise by the Call Judge. The sequence of gaits shall be Corto, Largo, walk, reverse at the walk and repeat. Upon instruction from the Judge, horses will be directed to traverse the sounding board sounding board in one

direction at a Corto and line up. Horses that do not demonstrate the required gait on the rail at a Corto and a Largo will be excused.

3. **Tests:** From the lineup, exhibitors will perform a series of tests individually. Each entry is asked to proceed at a Corto to the rail in a counter-clockwise direction to the point of the ring opposite the entry gate. Beginning at cone #1 located at the beginning of the turn, the entry will walk around the end of the ring along the rail to cone #2 located at the beginning of the straightaway where the entry will transition from the walk to a Largo and proceed down the straightaway to cone #3 located at the end of the straightaway. Beside cone #3 the entry will halt, stand for at least 5 seconds, and then back in a straight line a minimum of 4 steps. The entry will proceed at a Corto to the serpentine area, perform a serpentine at a Corto around stationary objects, placed 12-feet apart, and return to the lineup.
4. **Additional Tests:** Judges may request a repeat of any test for horses being considered for placement or may request additional tests as allowed in the PFHA Rule Book for the pleasure division.
5. **Penalties:** Horses will be penalized for failure to show change of speed from Corto to Largo; bad manners or attitude; failure to properly perform the individual tests; failure to perform the walk in a quiet and relaxed manner; turning on the sounding board before exiting; performing reverses towards the rail (that is not toward the center of the ring); and failure to back in a straight line showing evidence of a good mouth and quiet tail. Horses shall be excused for failure to perform the proper four-beat gait and for excessive bad manners.

6. **Appointments:** The tack will be the type as per the PFHA show rules in the pleasure division, including schooling tack. The attire of the rider will be the pleasure attire as per PFHA show rules.
7. **Other Rules:** To the extent not otherwise provided for specifically in these class rules, the rules and procedures of the USEF are incorporated by reference.

FABULOUS FUTURITY PERFORMANCE CLASS

Qualifying Gaits

1. **Collected Paso Corto** is an evenly spaced four-beat lateral gait with moderate forward speed and extension. This gait is smooth, supple, cadenced, animated and brilliant, with the horse well collected, fully balanced and exhibiting symmetry in flexion and extension. The horse should demonstrate pride, style elegance and enthusiasm, along with good manners and ready response.
2. **Collected Paso Largo** is an evenly spaced four-beat lateral gait. This gait is smooth, balanced, collected, bold and animated, with rapid forward motion. Extension and flexion must be harmonious with no tendency to become "light" on the front or strung out" behind. The horse should appear eager and willing to move out and a definite change of speed from the Collected Paso Corto to the Collected Paso Largo must be observed, yet a willingness to reduce speed on command must be demonstrated. All transitions between gaits should be performed evenly and smoothly. An even, four-beat cadence must be maintained, together with style, presence, boldness, and brilliance. Loss of form, cadence, or smoothness due to excessive speed shall be penalized.
3. **Collected Walk** is an evenly spaced four beat gait, cadenced, straight, brisk, animated and rhythmic. This gait is executed with collection, style and brilliance.

Judging

This class will be judged: 20% Collected Paso Corto; 20% Collected Paso Largo; 10% walk; 30% on the execution of the individual tests; 10% on appearance, conformation and way of going; and 10% on manners. Special attention shall be afforded to brilliance, form, smoothness and rhythmic consistency of the gaits.

Procedures

1. **Warm Up:** All entries will follow the Fabulous Futurity Pre-class Warm-up Procedure in the paddock before the class.
2. **Class Requirements:** Horses enter the ring to the right in a counter-clockwise manner at a Collected Paso Corto until directed by the Call Judge. The sequence of gaits shall be collected, Collected Paso Corto, Collected Paso Largo, Collected Paso Walk, reverse at the walk and repeat. Upon instruction from the Judge, horses will be directed to traverse the sounding board in one direction at a Collected Paso Corto and then line up. Horses that do not demonstrate the required gait on the rail at a Collected Paso Corto and Collected Paso Largo shall be excused.
3. **Tests:** From the lineup the exhibitors will perform a series of tests individually. Each entry is asked to proceed at a Collected Corto to the rail in a counter-clockwise direction to the point of the ring opposite the entry gate. Beginning at cone #1 located at the beginning of the turn, the entry will walk around the end of the ring along the rail to cone #2 located at the beginning of the straightaway. At cone # 2 the entry will transition from the walk to a Largo and proceed down the straightaway to cone #3 located at the end of the straightaway. Beside cone #3 the entry will halt, stand for at least 5 seconds, and then back in a straight line a minimum of 4 steps. The entry will proceed at a Collected Corto to the center of the ring, facing the sounding board and perform two figure eights to the right at the corto around stationary objects placed 12 feet apart. Then continue a Collected Paso Corto across the sounding board in one direction and return to the lineup.

4. **Additional Tests:** The Judges may request a repeat of any test of those horses being considered for placement or may request additional tests as allowed in the PFHA rule book for the performance division.
5. **Penalties:** Horses will be penalized for: bad manners, failure to show change of speed from Collected Paso Corto to Collected Paso Largo; failure to properly perform any individual tests; turning on the sounding board before exiting; performing reverses towards the rail; and not toward the center of the ring; and failure to back in a straight line showing evidence of a good mouth and quiet tail. Horses shall be excused for failure to perform the proper four-beat gait and for excessive bad manners.
6. **Appointments:** The tack will be English type. Tack will be the same as allowed under PFHA show rules for the Performance division, including schooling tack. The attire of the rider will be the official Paso Fino Show Costume.
7. **Other Rules:** To the extent not otherwise provided for specifically in these class rules, the rules and procedures of the USEF are incorporated by reference.

EXHIBITOR SPECIAL REQUESTS

All non-emergency issues or special requests must be relayed through show management to ensure prompt attention.

SPECIAL CLASSES

FABULOUS FUTURITY FINO CLASS

Qualifying Gaits

1. **Classic Fino:** An evenly spaced four-beat lateral gait that is smooth, animated, exciting and executed with brilliance and style. The horse must be fully collected and balanced, putting its complete dynamic energy into its carriage and the quickness of its footfall. Flexion and extension should be harmonious in all four legs, and the horse must demonstrate symmetry and fluidness of motion. The horse must perform this highly collected form of the gait naturally and willingly, and any indication that the horse is excessively restrained or held in gait shall be penalized. Extension is absolutely minimal. The horse's forward speed is extremely slow, whereas the footfall is exceedingly rapid. The loss of even cadence, or lack of smoothness as evidenced by an up and down or side-to-side movement of the horse's croup or the rider, shall be penalized.

Judging

In this class, horses shall demonstrate only the fully collected Classic Fino gait when they are moving. This class shall be judged 50% on execution and naturalness of the Classic Fino gait; 30% on the execution of the individual tests; 10% on appearance, conformation; and way of going; and 10% on manners.

Procedures

1. All entries will follow the Fabulous Futurity Pre-class Warm-up procedure in the paddock before the class.
2. Horses will enter the ring to the right in a counter-clockwise manner at a classic Fino until directed to reverse or halt by the call judge. The Judge will request a halt; proceed in gait; and reverse and repeat. Horses must

work in both directions. Upon instruction from the judge, horses will be directed to traverse the sounding board in one direction at a Classic Fino and then line up.

3. **Tests:** From the lineup the exhibitors will perform a series of tests individually. Each entry will perform two figure eights around stationary objects placed 10-feet apart. Riders will then halt, face the Judge and back in a straight line a minimum of 4 steps. Entries then will proceed to perform a serpentine around stationary objects, placed 10-feet apart, in both directions, then traverse the sounding board in both directions in the required gait. Upon completion the entry will return to the lineup.
4. **Tests:** The judges may request a repeat of any test of those horses being considered for placement or may request additional tests as allowed in the PFHA rule book for the Fino division.
5. **Penalties:** Horses will be penalized for bad manners, failure to properly perform the individual tests, turning on the sounding board before exiting, performing reverses towards the rail (that is not toward the center of the ring); and failure to back in a straight line showing evidence of a good mouth and quiet tail. Horses shall be excused for failure to perform the proper four-beat gait and for excessive bad manners.
6. **Appointments:** The tack will be English type. Tack will be the same as allowed under PFHA show rules for the Fino division, including schooling tack. The attire of the rider will be the official Paso Fino Show Costume.

7. **Other Rules:** To the extent not otherwise provided for specifically in these class rules, the rules and procedures of the USEF are incorporated by reference.

USEF MEMBERSHIP STATEMENT

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, or agent at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

AGILITY CLASS INSTRUCTIONS

1. Enter the arena on the rail at a corto. Proceed to the figure eight.
2. Perform one figure eight starting to the right.
3. Proceed to the sounding board. Traverse the sounding board at the corto in one direction.
4. Reverse to the right. Traverse the sounding board in the other direction at the corto.
5. In the middle of the sounding board Halt for 5 seconds.
6. Walk off the sounding board to the far rail.
7. At the far rail pick up the canter on the correct lead.
8. Canter on the rail to the opposite side of the arena.
9. At the end of the rail reverse and change leads to the correct lead.
10. Canter on the rail to the other end of the arena
11. At the end of the rail reverse and change leads to the correct lead. Continue on the rail.
12. At the middle of the rail transition to the largo
13. Largo to the exit.

SUPER HORSE

OBSTACLE CLASS INSTRUCTIONS

1. Enter through gate. Time starts.
2. Go to rollback away from rail to other roll back away from rail
3. Enter 3 sided box.
Do 360 in both directions
4. Go to third barrel. Halt.
5. Back serpentine around barrels both ways and end at halt.
6. Pick up garrocha pole.
7. Go to marked spot and do full circle both directions. Replace pole.
8. Proceed to rope. Pick up rope and head to the steer.
9. Rope steer the best way you can while remaining on horse. Once steer is roped time is stopped.

SUPER HORSE

To win this competition, entries must compete in **four elements** at the 2026 Grand National Show: a Bella Forma class; a divisional class (performance, pleasure or fino); and both the Super Horse Agility and the Super Horse Timed Obstacle classes.

Points will be awarded for each element and the highest scoring horse will be awarded the title: **PFHA GRAND NATIONAL SHOW 2026 SUPER HORSE**. Prize money will be paid out to the top six places in both the amateur and open divisions.

Entry Requirements

1. Open to Amateurs and Professionals 18 years old and over.
2. Any PFHA registered Paso Fino horse 36 months and older may enter.
3. A separate Super Horse Competition entry form is required (provided in the GNS prize list).
4. Entries must be submitted with a regular show entry form by the GNS entry deadline.
5. Championship, youth and specialty classes will **not** be included in point totals.
6. Horses in amateur divisions must compete in amateur classes; open entries in open classes. Cross-entry is not permitted.
7. **Required per horse:** a Bella Forma class, a divisional class (performance pleasure or fino), and both the Super Horse Agility and the Super Horse Timed Obstacle classes.

Tack and Attire

For the Agility and Timed Obstacle classes: appropriate and legal per the PFHA Rulebook for the Pleasure division.

For the Bella Forma and divisional classes: appropriate and legal per the PFHA Rulebook for those respective classes.

Procedures and Notes

Divisional and Bella Forma class procedures follow the PFHA Rulebook. Patterns for the Agility and Timed Obstacle classes are in the prize list. Points are awarded to the **horse**, not the rider—riders may be changed between classes. Disqualification from a class forfeits that class's points but does not eliminate the horse from competition.

BREEDERS' SWEEPSTAKES CLASSES

The Breeders' Sweepstakes classes are Bella Forma classes with specific requirements.

The following are the procedures for the classes:

1. Entries will enter the ring one at a time.
2. Each entry will enter the ring at a walk and will walk directly towards the judges to be inspected by the judges for inheritable traits (mouth deformities, reproduction deformities, etc.).
3. The entry will then walk up and down the Sounding board for the judges to look for any type of lameness.
4. The entry will then proceed to the rail and wait for further examination after all the entries are present. It is acceptable for entries to be lunging while waiting.
5. Each entry will then perform individually for further examinations by the judges.
6. The entry will be examined while lunging in both directions in gait.
7. The entry will then gait in a straight line away from and back to the judges.
8. The entry will then be squared for overall conformation inspection.
9. The entry will then be lined up for placement.

The appointments for the Breeders' Sweepstakes classes are as follows:

- The handler shall wear plain dress pants (may be the official Paso Fino costume) with a plain colored shirt.
- A hat of either official costume or pleasure style is acceptable, along with boots
- The horse is to be fitted with a plain halter and lead shank at least eight (8) feet in length. The Colombian jaquima is acceptable.
- The horse should be shown groomed and clipped.

Horses are eligible to be entered even if their breeding was not purchased through the SSA in 2023. If your horse qualifies, simply pay the class entry fee and the nomination fee of \$220. **2023 stallion owners and the winning bidder each receive one free nomination to one of the Breeders' Sweepstakes classes.**

The Prize Purse is subject to total money collected for nominations and class fees. We will update the amount as the show approaches.

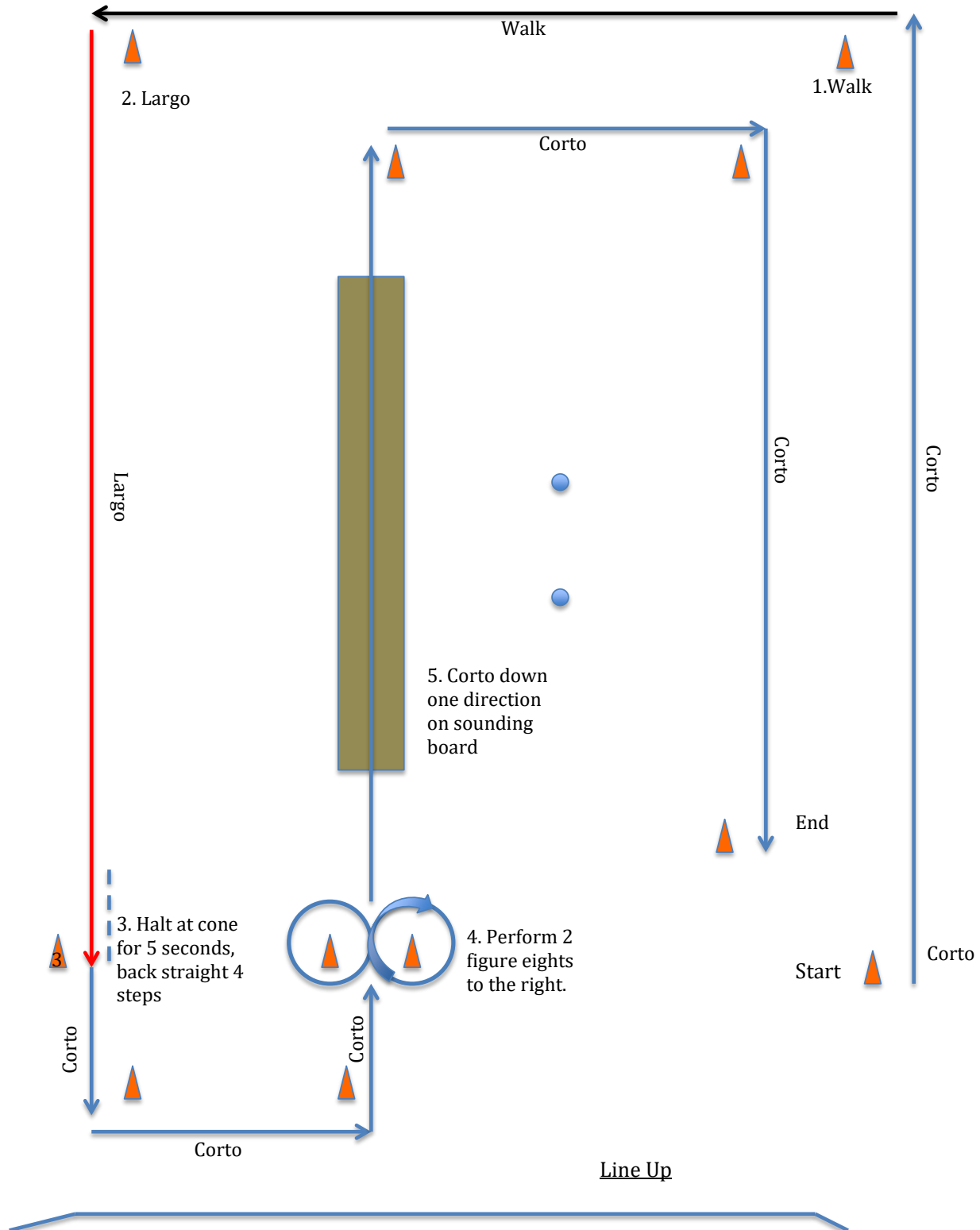

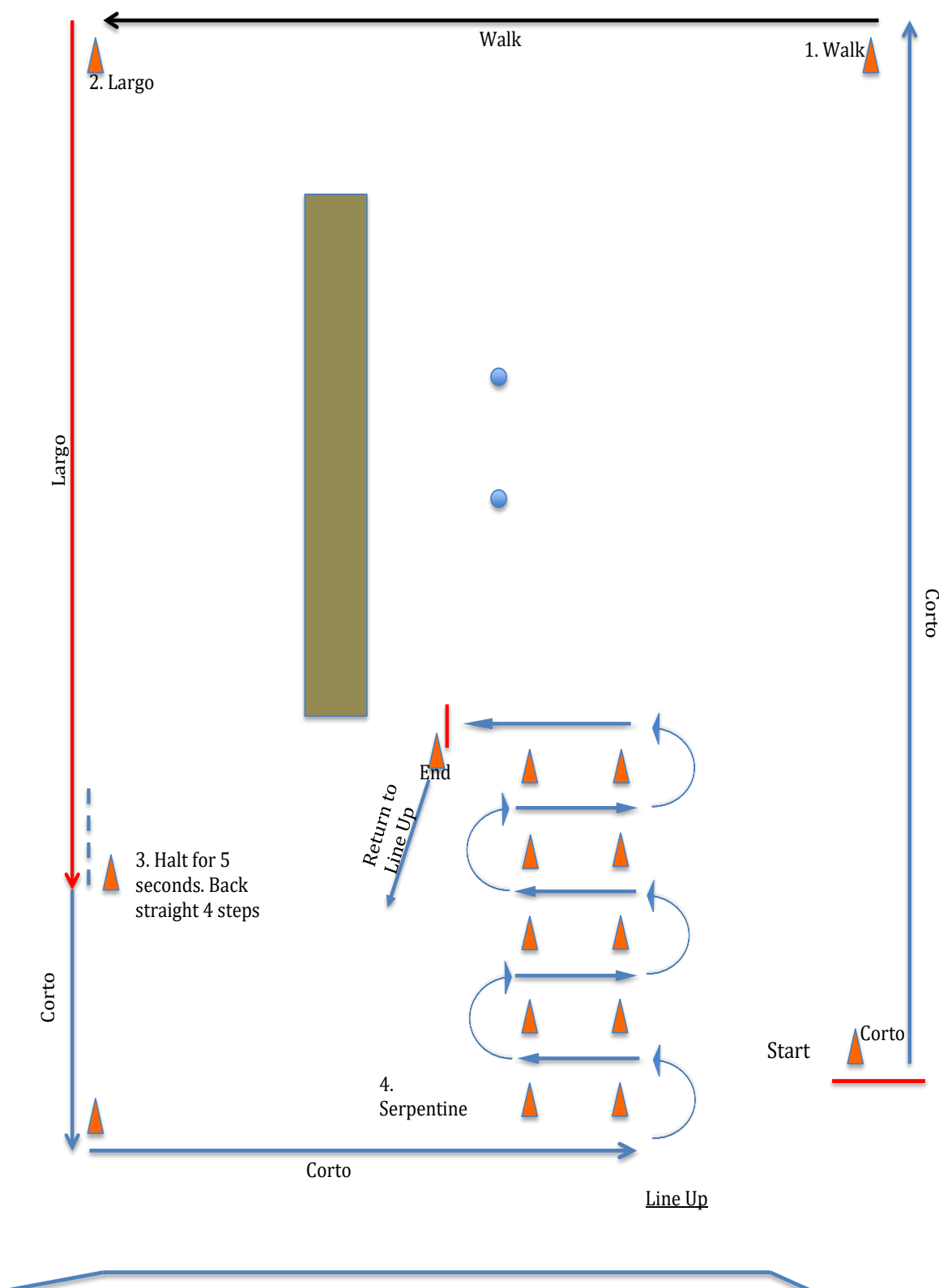

PATTERNS FABULOUS PERFORMANCE FUTURITY



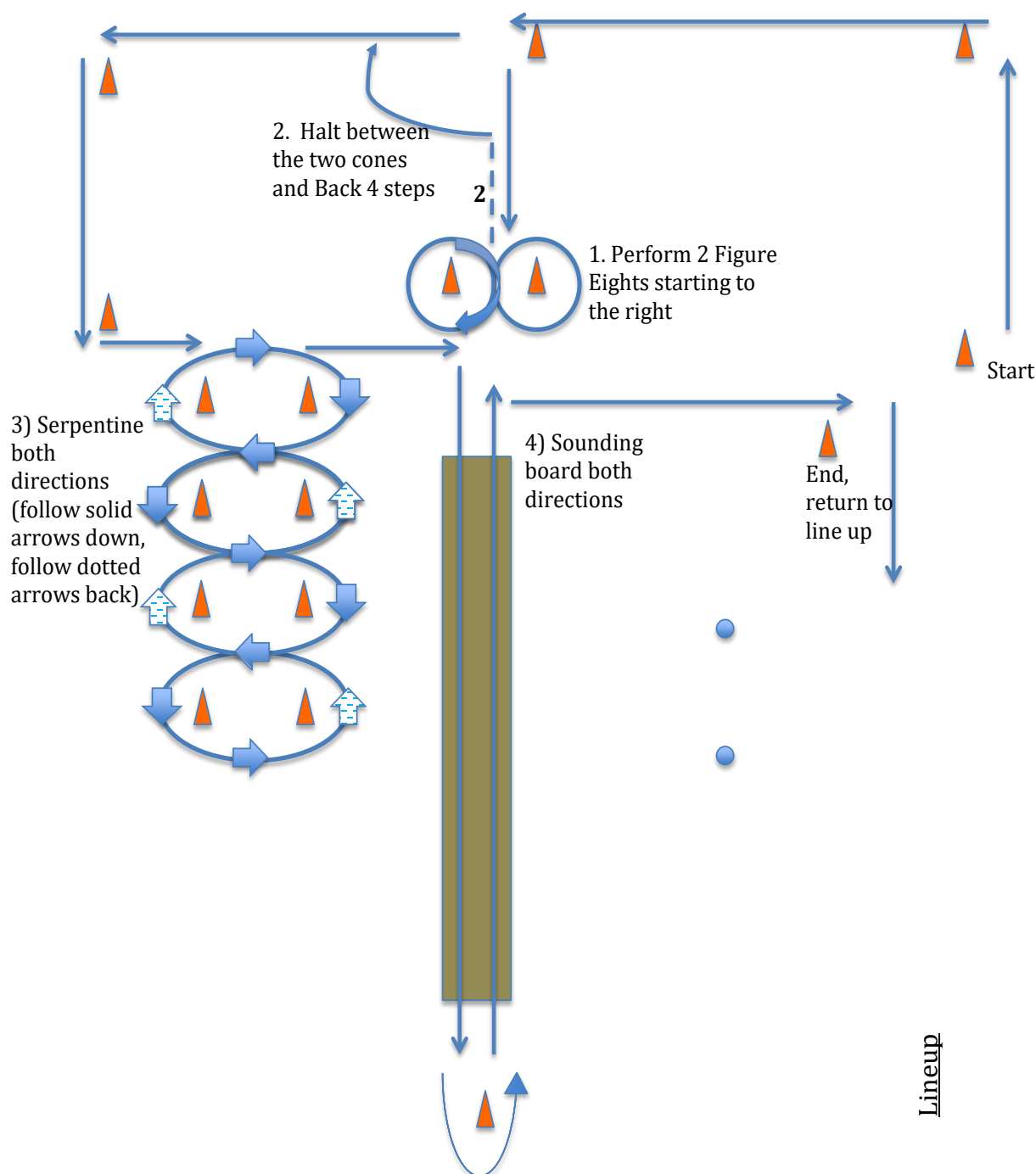

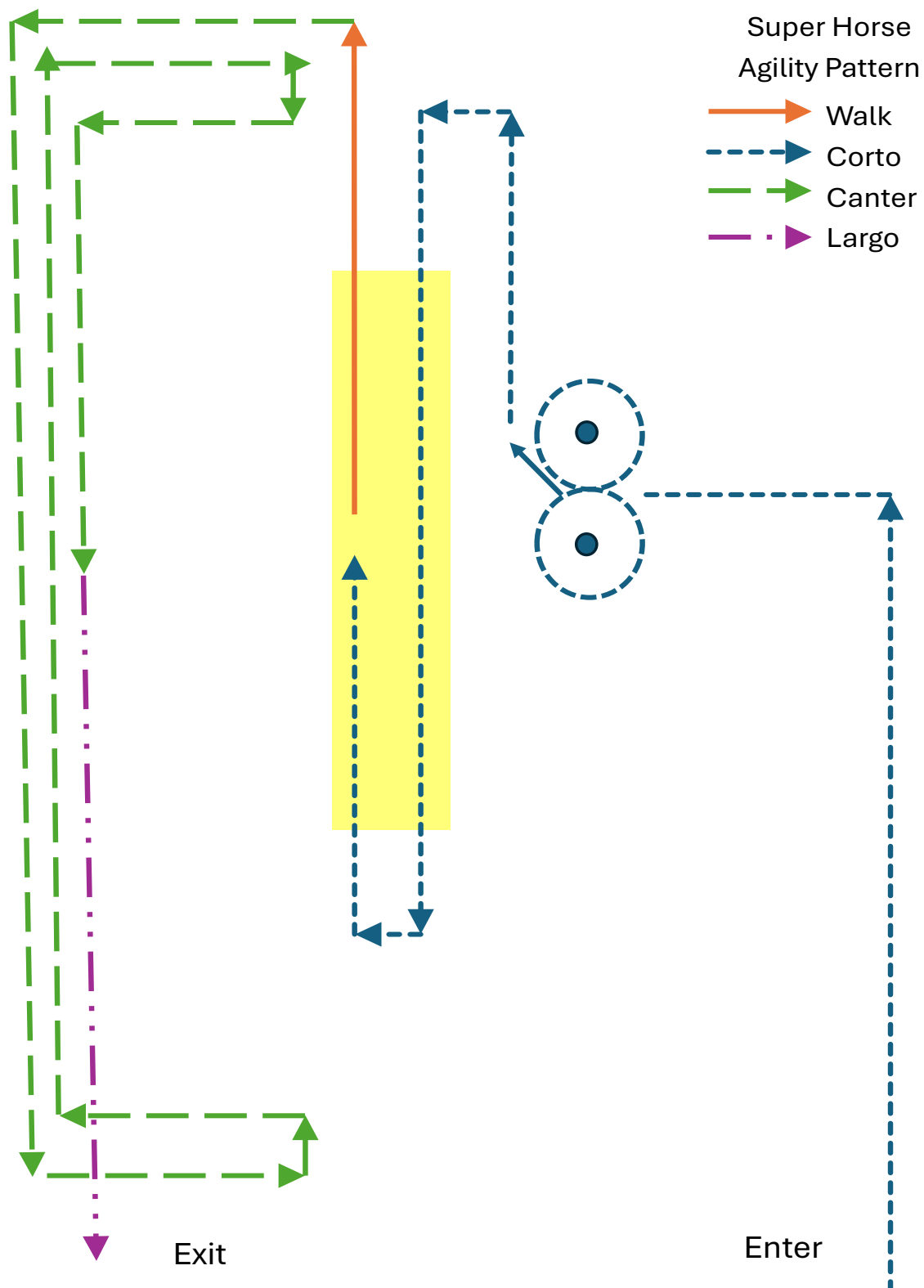
PATTERNS FABULOUS PLEASURE FUTURITY

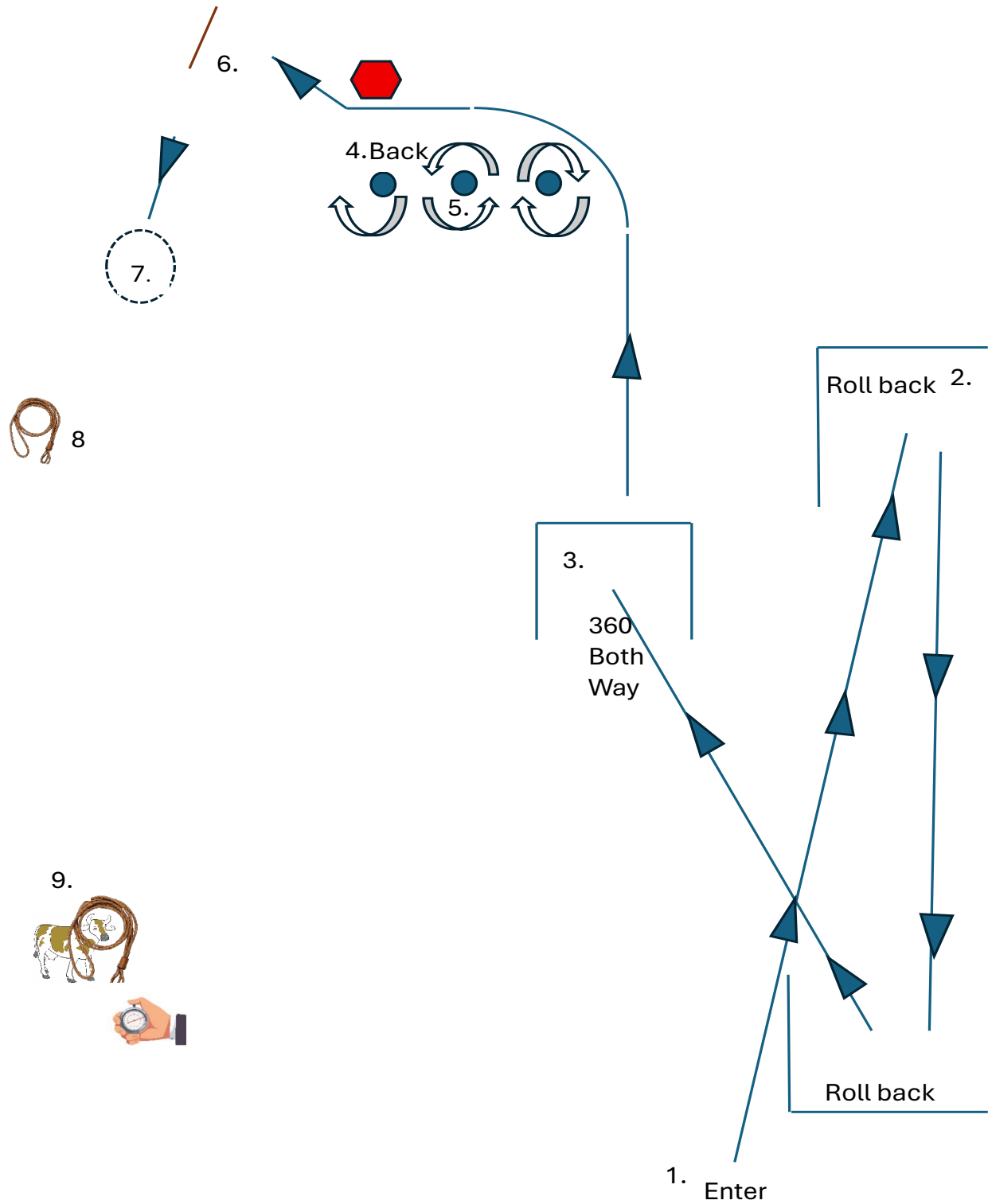
PATTERNS FABULOUS FINO FUTURITY

OTHER MODALITY CLASS RULES

Please refer to PFHA Diagonal Handbook for questions regarding other modality classes

Qualifying Gaits

- **Trocha** is the typical way of movement, considered a gait, for some horses which is measured in a rhythmical and harmonious tempo but in four uneven beats, identified by the four beats when the sequence of the cycle is performed. Its sound follows a 1-1-1-1 rhythm.
- **Galope** or canter is a movement of forward diagonal propulsion in three beats: the first stage begins with the striking of one hind leg; the second stage is taken by the opposite hind leg and the foreleg diagonal to it; then the third stage is completed when the last foreleg hits the ground. The beat makes a 1-2-3, 1-2-3 sound.
- **Trote** is the movement described by successive and alternating diagonally paired leg positions or bipeds executed in two beats, which produces a striking sound when making contact with the ground. It sounds like a 1-2, 1-2 sound.

Procedures Trocha

Trocha – Reverse – Trocha – Reverse – Sounding Board – Lineup – Back horse (four to six steps)

(Additional): Trocha – Reverse – Trocha – Reverse – Sounding Board – Lineup

Procedures Trocha Y Galope & Trote Y Galope

Trote or Trocha – Galope – Reverse – Trote or Trocha – Galope – Reverse – Trote or Trocha – Sounding Board – Galope – Sounding Board – Lineup – Back horse (four to six steps).

(Additional): Trote or Trocha – Galope – Trote or Trocha – Trote or Trocha – Sounding Board in one direction – Galope sounding board in opposite direction – Return to lineup in trote or trocha

Mandatory Individual Tests

- Figure Eight:** to be performed in both directions for each gait or modality. Two times on each gait or modality for a total of four times, finishing in the middle of the poles facing the middle of the ring or the Judge. Horses of one modality (Trocha) should perform four figure eights on one modality.
- Back:** A minimum of four (4) and maximum of six (6) steps.
- Sounding Board:** Traverse the board in both directions. For horses of more than one modality (Trote and Galope) one direction in one modality, returning on the second modality.

Judging Criteria Percentages: 50% Execution and naturalness of the gait; 25% appearance and conformation; and 25% manners and way of going.

NON-POINTED CLASSES

OPPORTUNITY RESCUE CLASS

(Non-Pointed)

The purpose of this class is to raise awareness to the horses that need a second chance for a healthy, loving and productive life and to the Rescue Organizations committed to providing humane treatment for all equines through education, research and quality care, striving to find nurturing homes for the horses.

Horses in this class do not have to be registered, but owners and riders must be current PFHA members

Entries must submit a brief statement on their rescue story (maximum of two minutes). Please email to show secretary, entries@pfha.org by 5 p.m., Thursday, October 2. Entry Form on pages 28-29.

Tack and Attire Requirement

Tack and attire for the Rescue Class will be appropriate and legal as described in the PFHA Rulebook for the Pleasure division.

Class Procedure

- Exhibitors will enter one at a time.
- Story will be read as each exhibitor enters ring, one (1)-by-one (1).
- Exhibitor will enter the ring in his or her favorite Paso Fino gait.
- Every exhibitor must circle the ring once, in a counterclockwise manner and line up.
- Once all horses are in the lineup, the class will begin rail work according to the procedures of the Pleasure Division.

OPPORTUNITY JACK BENNY

(Non-Pointed)

The Jack Benny class is open to amateur riders age 62 and older. Horses in this class will perform either the fino or corto gait and preference will not be given to one type of gait over the other.

Tack and attire must be legal for PFHA fino, performance or pleasure divisions. Schooling headgear will be allowed for schooling age horses or pleasure horses. Horses must be 36 months of age or older as per PFHA show rules.

Procedure: Exhibitors shall enter the ring to the right on the rail and circle the arena in a counterclockwise manner at the fino or corto gait. Sequence of gaits will be corto or fino, walk, reverse, corto or fino, walk and line up. Each rider shall be asked to demonstrate the back from the line up.

If a work-off is requested by the judge, entries may be asked to gait or walk on the rail, reverse in gait or at the walk, and halt and stand on the rail as tests.

Judging criteria: 50% on rhythmic consistency and quality of gait (no preference given to fino or corto gait); 25% on smoothness and naturalness of gait; 25% on manners, attitude, and obedience. Special consideration should be given to suitability of the horse for an amateur rider. Any indication of bad manners should be heavily penalized.

Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

JUDGING SYSTEM

Under the Majority Opinion System (M-O-S), all three judges carry equal weight in the final class decision and winners are placed by the best two out of three votes. Each horse is judged as if it were working individually and then compared with the performance of all other horses in the class who are judged on the same basis.

All judges place the same number of entries in each class, depending on class size. Ties are resolved by averaging the opinions of the three judges.

- The Judges must work independently and tie a maximum of three reserve places. They should vary and rotate their judging positions in the ring.
- The Ringmaster must verify the proper number of placings on each judge's card. In the event of a work off, he should make certain all judges know what horses are working and for which positions.
- The Announcer must call for horses in a work off in numerical order.

JUDGING

Judges must work independently, with no discussion of any kind until the winners are announced. They should vary their judging positions and rotate around the ring. They should discuss and plan how to cover the ring and work classes before the show to avoid "cluster" judging.

ROTATION

Each class will have a Call Judge, assigned by rotation.

PLACINGS

Each judge will place the class and is recommended to have two reserves (past the honorable mention) indicated on the card in case of disqualification. Obviously, this will not occur if there are only 7 or less horses in a given class. The Ringmaster will return an incompletely placed card to the judge for correction before giving it to the Scorer.

WORK OFFS

Any judge may request a work off in any class by communicating through the Ringmaster. The judge making the request must state what horses he/she wants called and what positions they are to be worked for. The Ringmaster relates this to the other judges one at a time.

A work off requires agreement by two of the three or the positions must be filled without a work off. Any judge may request a work off in any class by communicating through the Ringmaster. The judge making the request must state what horses he/she wants called and what positions they are to be worked for. The Ringmaster relates this to the other judges one at a time. A work off requires agreement by two of the three or the positions must be filled without a work off.

If a work off is agreed upon, the Ringmaster must ask the other Judges if they wish to add other horses to those being sent to the rail. The Ringmaster must be sure that all judges know what horses are working for what position.

In order to be included in a work off, an entry must appear on two judges' lists. If an entry does not receive two votes for inclusion in the work off, that entry does not return to the rail. If no entries receive two work off votes, there is no work off and the class is placed.

The Ringmaster must inform the Announcer of the work off request. Whenever horses are being called for a work off, the Announcer must call for them in numerical order.

AUTOMATIC WORK OFFS (Identical Tie for First Place)

When a three way identical tie occurs for first place, a work off is mandatory.

If the tie is still identical after the work off, the class will be placed by the fall of the cards.

At no time will horses be asked or required to perform more than one work off per class – except in Equitation.

When an identical three-way tie is for second place or lower, the class is determined by the fall of the cards.

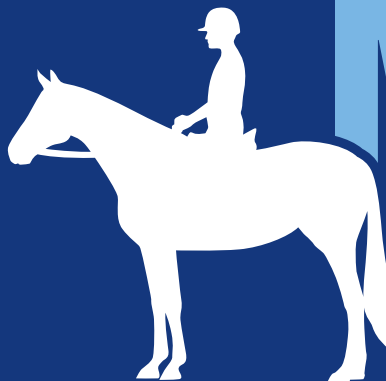

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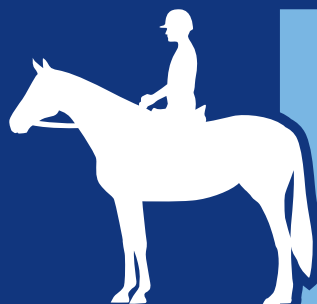
